


World Mythology Bloom Ball Project



This is a paired project, meaning no more than TWO in a group. It will assess you through the different levels of Bloom's Taxonomy, a method of categorizing higher level thinking skills.

- You will be given a total of 12 panels. I suggest that you do a rough draft for each section on notebook paper before you create the final draft on the panel.
- Complete steps 1-12 below in your circles.
- The tabs of each panel [the part that's not the pentagon] must be decorated with some recurring image or symbol from the text.
- The Bloom Ball should be visually interesting, so use colored pencils, sharpies, pencil drawings colored with crayon, or markers, to decorate each circle.
- When all of the steps are completed, put each panel in sequential order and place them together—DO NOT CUT OUT YET—for grading. Be sure to include the grading rubric at the end. After each project is graded, we will cut out the panels and hang your projects!

Panel Instructions

1. Create a title panel with the name of the culture you are studying and if there is a separate religion name state that as well. Plan the lettering to use up the entire space and to be attractive. Spell everything correctly!
2. Show a map of the geographic location of this belief system's origins.
3. List the main gods/goddesses. Some belief systems have MANY so you may need to really focus on the few main ones.
4. Summarize their creation myth if possible. If they do not have one, find one origin myth and summarize.
5. Draw or create a picture to illustrate a major event from the creation story.
6. List any major heroes in this mythology: they can be divine, semi-divine, or human. Illustrate this with at least one hero's picture.
7. Pick a story of one of the heroes and summarize.
8. Research rituals or worship associated with this belief system. Give a brief description of them and include illustrations.
9. Draw or create some artwork from this culture depicting a story from their mythology.
10. Write an evaluation of how you think this mythology reflects its culture of origin. You may need to do some research into the location's history and consider what they held to be important. What was their political structure? Is this reflected in the mythology?
11. Pick an additional story from their mythology and briefly recount it for us on this panel.

12. What is this culture like today? Do they exist in the same form? Do they believe in the same things? What religion are they now if not? Give a brief comparison or description of the current culture.

Each panel is worth 8 points [that equals 96, I'm throwing 4 points on].

8-EXCEEDS basic content requirements. Went above and beyond.

7-MEETS basic content requirements.

6- Sloppy or seems halfhearted but meets basic requirements.

5- Doesn't really meet minimum requirements. (Remember! Tab decorations count!!!)
